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Born in 1935 in Pavia, Italy, Giovanni Berlucchi graduated in Medicine at the University of Pavia in 1959. He did post-graduate work at the Institute of Physiology of the University of Pisa as a fellow of the National Research Council of Italy, at the California Institute of Technology as a fellow of the Public Health Service of the United States, and at the University of Pennsylvania as a Research Associate. He became a full Professor of Physiology at the University of Siena in 1975, and then moved to the University of Pisa in 1976 and to the University of Verona in 1983. His research work is in the field of the neural bases of cognition and behavior, with specific interests in vision and visuospatial attention, interactions and functional differences between the cerebral hemispheres, and the body schema.

Berlucchi is a fellow of the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei, the Accademia Europaea, the Accademia Rodinensis pro Remediatione of Stockholm, the Istituto Veneto di Scienze Lettere ed Arti, the Istituto Lombardo di Scienze Lettere ed Arti, and a foreign member of the Society for Neuroscience and the EEG Deutsche Gesellschaft. He was President of the Italian Physiological Society from 1999 to 2001 and has received a degree honoris causa in Psychology from the University of Pavia in 2007.

He has been a member of the Council of the European Neuroscience Association, a Committee member of the European Brain and Behaviour Society, a member of the Council of Scientists of the Human Frontier Science Organization, and is presently a member of the Governing Council of the International Brain Research Organization and of the Executive Board of the International Council for Science (ICSU). He has been the Editor-in-Chief of the journal *Neuropsychologia* (1995-1999), a receiving editor for the journals *Experimental Brain Research* and *European Journal of Neuroscience*, and has served or serves on the editorial boards of various journals specializing in the brain sciences..

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
